1. The use or display of artificial flowers is prohibited.
2. Plants will not be accepted for exhibition unless they have been growing in containers for at least two months.
3. All entries must have been grown by exhibitor (except for arrangements).
4. Flowers and plants must be of more than ordinary standard and quality to be entitled for an award.
5. Small gummed name label or a rubber stamp are time-saving in filling out tags.
